1. Rules

The organizing authority for this aspect of the Junior Regatta is Starcross Yacht Club.

The racing will be governed by the rules as defined in **The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) - 2021-2024**.

The national prescriptions of the RYA (from 1 January 2021) will also apply.

Changes to the racing rules will be indicated in the relevant instructions to which they apply. Changes to the RRS in the Sailing Instructions are only valid if they comply with rule 86.1(a).

2. Disclaimer of Liability

Competitors participate in Starcross YC racing events entirely at their own risk - see RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority (Starcross YC) will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after a SYC racing event.

The safety of the boat and her entire management including insurance shall be the sole responsibility of the owner/competitor who must ensure that the boat and crew are adequate to face the conditions that may arise in the course of the race. Neither the establishment of this Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions, nor

the inspection of the boat under these conditions in any way limits or reduces the absolute responsibility of the owner/competitor for his/her crew, his/her boat and its management.

By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- (a) they are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- (b) they are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- (c) they accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- (d) their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- (e) the provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- (f) the provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances;
- (g) it is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event.

3. Sailing Instructions

Sailing Instructions for each fleet will be available on the regatta website no later than 1st August 2021.

4. Communications

Notices to competitors will also be posted on the official notice board located at Starcross YC and communicated via the event WhatsApp group.

5. Safety

Rule 40.1 shall apply at all times whilst afloat - each competitor shall wear a personal flotation device except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment. Wetsuits and drysuits are not personal flotation devices.

Please note that all competitors must launch from and land at Starcross Yacht Club. Location details can be found on the SYC website www.starcrossyc.org.uk

Competitors will be required to take the tally wristband with their allocated number from the board on the slipway when launching and return it when landing. Full details will be given at the Event Briefing.

When the race committee considers that a boat or competitor is in difficulty it may instruct the boat or competitor to accept outside help, retire or sail ashore.

A boat that retires or does not start shall notify an official boat as soon as possible and shall not return to shore without the express permission of that safety boat.

If necessary, for safety reasons, boats may be secured and the helm and crew taken aboard a committee or other designated boat until such time as they/their boat can be returned to shore.

Code flag L: when displayed afloat this means 'come within hailing distance or follow this boat'. When Code Flag L is displayed on the Committee Boat accompanied by a single sound signal, competitors shall complete their race and proceed to the leeward side of the committee boat and follow instructions given. Instructions may be verbal or written on a board. When displayed ashore this means 'a notice to competitors has been posted'.

6. Entry and Eligibility

The regatta is open to all monohull dinghies with an RYA PY handicap of 1147 and above.

Entries can only be made for a single rig where boats have multiple rig options.

The regatta is only open to amateur sailors with birthdates between 1/4/13 and 31/8/03 (ie 8-18 years).

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum third party cover of £3,000,000. When entering online competitors are deemed to have accepted this insurance requirement.

Entries should be made online using the link found on the Junior Regatta website – online booking form at [Junior Regatta - Starcross Yacht Club \(starcrossyc.org.uk\)](http://starcrossyc.org.uk) **Entry closes at midnight on Sunday 1st August 2021.**

Competitors and / or their Guardians (unless explicitly not granted on the consent form) automatically grant to the organising Authority (and any party to which they may delegate this right), without payment the right in perpetuity to make, use and show (including via the internet), any motion pictures, still pictures, live, taped or filmed television, or any other form of media, of or relating to the Exe Regatta.

The Junior Regatta is free to enter to members of sailing clubs on the river Exe. Entry fee is £10 to visitors.

7. Measurement

Each competitor is responsible for ensuring that their boat complies with class rules and regulations. The Race Officers or the Sailing Officers may request an inspection of a boat at any time.

Boats are permitted to use sails carrying a distinguishing number other than that under which the boat is registered (as required by RRS Appendix G), with the following constraints:

- a. It is not permitted to use a distinguishing number which is already being used by a boat of the same class in the race.
- b. The sail number to be used for the regatta must be clearly reported when entering the race. Any change of sail number must be reported to the Race Office before launching.

Sail numbers are not required on spinnakers. This changes RRS Appendix G,1,1 and G.1.3 (d)

8. Race Schedule

The event briefing will be at 9:30 on Saturday 14th August, on the grassed area outside the Clubhouse. The timings of subsequent daily briefings with course details etc will be published on the Official Noticeboard, but will be in the region of 30 minutes before the first scheduled start of the day.

9. Racing Area and Courses

Courses will be displayed on the shore and described at the daily briefings.

The racing area shall be on the River Exe in the area bounded by Lymptone SC and Starcross YC and navigation buoys 33 and 18

10. Protest and dispute proceedings

Competitors should note that Starcross YC implements the RYA Racing Charter and that they will be expected to sail in compliance with it. The charter can be found at the front of the RYA edition of the Racing Rules of Sailing 2021-2024 (the yellow pages after the definitions), or on the RYA website at www.rya.org.uk/racingrules.

The Post-Race Penalty, Advisory Meeting and RYA Arbitration of the RYA Rules Disputes procedures shall apply (for information on the procedures, go to www.rya.org.uk/go/rulesdisputes). The outcome of an RYA Arbitration can be referred to a protest committee, but an arbitration cannot be reopened or appealed.

11. Scoring

The low point scoring system of RRS Appendix A will apply.

One race is required to be completed to constitute a series. If four races are sailed, the worst result for each competitor will not be included in the series scoring. If 8 races are sailed, the two worst results for each competitor will not be included in the series scoring.

12. Prizes

Prize giving will take place at Starcross Yacht Club on Tuesday 17th August from 15:30hrs- subject to any protest hearings having been completed.

13. Support Boats

Team leaders, coaches and other support persons shall stay outside areas where boats are racing from the time of the warning signal for the first fleet start until all boats have finished or retired or the Race Officers signals a postponement, general recall or abandonment.

14. Advertising

Advertising on boats, sails and clothing is permitted in accordance with the World Sailing Advertising Code [Regulation 20].

Boats shall display specific event advertising supplied by the Junior Regatta if requested in an amendment to the Sailing Instructions. If this instruction is broken, World Sailing Regulation 20.9.2 applies.

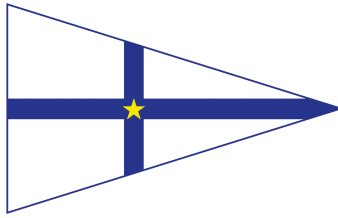
15. Trash Disposal

Please read these Sailing Instructions in conjunction with the Notice of Race for the Junior Regatta.

1. Changes to the Sailing Instructions

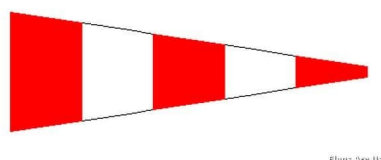
Any change to the Sailing Instructions (SIs) will be posted no less than two hours before the scheduled start time of the race or races concerned, except that any change to the planned schedule of races will be posted by 2200 hrs on the day before it will take effect.

Changes in the Sailing Instructions will be signalled by displaying flag “L” from the Starcross YC flagpole. Flag “L” will be lowered after the relevant racing has commenced.

2. Signals Made Ashore

Signals made ashore will be displayed on the Starcross YC flagpole.

When flag AP is displayed ashore ‘1 minute’, in ‘Race Signals’ is replaced with ‘not less than 15 minutes’. This changes the meaning of AP in RRS Race Signals.

3. Schedule of Races / Racing Area

The race schedule is defined in the Notice of Race.

Racing on both days will be held in the Exe estuary. The racing will take place in the area bounded approximately by Powderham Point, Lypstone, Red Navigation Buoy 18 and Red Navigation Buoy 20. The actual courses will depend on the wind and tidal conditions on the day.

All racing will be started using a Committee Boat line. The Committee boat will display an orange flag when on station. All Races will use a Committee Boat start, a course defined by these Sailing Instructions and a finish on the Starcross Yacht Club line between the SYC flagpole and No. 29 (green) buoy.

On completion of the first race on each day, competitors shall return to the Committee Boat area ready for the second race, which will be started as soon as practicable after completion of the first race.

On each day there will be 2 separate starts in the following order:

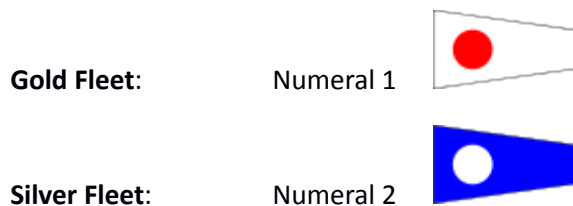
1. Gold Fleet
2. Silver Fleet

4. Class Flags

Boats will be divided into two fleets: Gold and Silver. The Gold Fleet is for children who have raced before and are confident sailors. The Silver Fleet is for those who have little (if any) racing experience but are able

to sail a triangle. There will be coaching and support around the course from a coach boat for this fleet. Silver Fleet boats will be supplied with a coloured ribbon to secure at the masthead for easy identification.

The Class flags for each fleet will be as follows:



5. The Courses

Courses will be displayed ashore on the club course board, and discussed at daily Briefings.

Boats shall complete the number of laps of the course as displayed on the Committee Boat.

6. Marks

The marks used will be described at the daily Briefings

For all fleets, the pin end (outer distance mark) of the start will be a red spherical buoy. The Committee Boat will be the other end of the start line.

7. The Start

All races will be started in accordance with RRS rule 26. (Start sequence 5 - 4 -1 - Start). The start signal for the Gold fleet start will be the preparatory signal for the Silver fleet. The start line will be between the mast of the Committee Boat and the outer distance mark .

In the event of a general recall for the Gold fleet, that fleet will be restarted in sequence, before the Silver fleet start.

In the event of a general recall, it is likely that the PRO will use a Black Flag start for subsequent starts in accordance with Rule 30.4.

A boat starting later than 5 minutes after her starting signal will be scored 'Did Not Start' without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.2.

8. Change of the Next leg of the Course

The race committee may move any mark up to 100m without signalling the change. This changes rule 33.

For more significant course changes Flag C will be flown from the Committee Boat and safety boats will advise competitors verbally at the preceding mark of the course.

9. The Finish

The finish line shall be displayed on the club course board as part of the course description.

All boats shall complete the number of laps of the course as displayed on the Committee Boat.

The race may be shortened from the Committee Boat using flag S. All boats will finish the next time they cross the Start/Finish line after Flag S is displayed, with accompanying sound signals.

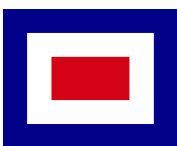
10. Time Limits

The time limit for the first boat to finish in each fleet shall be 60 minutes. Boats failing to finish within 20 minutes after the first boat finishes in their fleet shall be scored Did Not Finish without a hearing. This changes RRS35, A5.1 and A5.2

The target finish time for the first boat is 45 minutes.

11. Alternative position recording procedure

When one or more boat has sailed the course and finished, the Race Committee may apply an **alternative position recording procedure**. A Race Committee Vessel displaying flag W may notify a boat still racing that she will be scored in a place corresponding to her position on the water. The boat, once notified, shall return to the starting area, if further races are scheduled, or return ashore. The boat will be scored in the place as recorded by the Race Committee vessel. This changes rule RRS 28.1, A4.2.

When the alternative position recording procedure is in operation the Race Committee will extend the Time Limit after the first boat finishes until all boats still racing have a recorded place.

12. Silver fleet coaching

The Silver fleet will be coached during racing by a coach boat. RRS 41 will not apply to any assistance provided to Silver fleet competitors by officials on the Committee boat, rescue boats or the coach boat.

11. Protests, Redress Hearings and Post-race penalties

Post race penalty

A boat that may have broken a rule of Part 2 of the Racing Rules of Sailing or rule 31 may, after finishing the race concerned and before the start of any related protest hearing, notify the race committee that it accepts a Post-Race Penalty. Such a penalty shall be a 30% scoring penalty (SCP) calculated as stated in rule 44.3(c), except that the minimum penalty is three places and the boat shall not be scored worse than the number of boats that came to the starting area. However, if the boat caused injury or serious damage or, despite taking a penalty, gained a significant advantage in the race or series by its breach, its penalty shall be to retire.

When a Post-Race Penalty is accepted: (a) neither the boat nor a protest committee may then revoke or remove the penalty. (b) the boat shall not be penalised further in a protest hearing when the protest committee decides that it was appropriate to the facts found and the applicable rules.

Advisory meeting

When there is an incident that will not result in the lodging of a protest or a request for redress, a boat may request an advisory meeting by notifying the race committee, and notifying any boat involved in the incident.

An adviser will then call a meeting to learn what may have happened and will state whether any rule appears to have been broken, and by which boat. A boat may as a result notify the race office that it accepts a Post-Race Penalty when it applies to the incident, or choose to retire, but is not required to do so.

RYA Arbitration

Protest forms may be obtained from the race office at Starcross YC.

The protest time limit is 60 minutes after the last boat has finished the last race of the day, on that course. This time limit may be extended by the Race Committee if appropriate.

Notices will be posted no later than 15 minutes after the expiry of the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties to, or named as, witnesses.

After a protest is lodged, the race committee will offer RYA Arbitration.

If the parties and the protest committee agree that RYA Arbitration is suitable, an arbitrator (who may be a member of the protest committee) will call an arbitration. When it is the arbitrator's opinion that a boat that is a party to the arbitration has broken a rule for which the Post-Race Penalty is available, the party will be invited to accept that penalty and, if all such penalties are accepted, the protesting boat will be allowed to withdraw the protest, changing rule 63.1.

When any of the following conditions apply; (1) a party to the protest does not agree to RYA Arbitration, (2) the arbitrator's opinion is that the Post-Race Penalty is not applicable to the incident, (3) a boat may be entitled to redress, (4) a boat does not accept an offered Post-Race penalty, (5) the protest is not withdrawn, there will be a protest committee hearing.

The arbitrator may be a member of the protest committee.

Any boat is entitled to accept a Post-Race Penalty at any time before the start of the protest committee hearing and receive protection from further penalisation. The boat may also retire.

RRS 66 and 70 (reopening and appeal, respectively) do not apply to an RYA Arbitration since this is not a protest committee decision or procedure.
